Through a program called Face to Face, two of NYU's gifted facial plastic surgeons are offering their services to victims of domestic violence—and they're doing it free of charge. Face to Face is a joint program of the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence. Philip J. Miller, MD, and Minas S.

Constantinides, MD, are among 225 surgeons across the country who have dedicated themselves to helping and healing the victims of this widespread form of violence. On Wednesday, October 25, the CBS Early Show highlighted both Dr. Miller and one of his special Face to Face patients.
